

The Police and Crime Commissioner Has approved the following grants for 2013/14. The grants are funded by Community Safety Funding received from the Home Office (£771,000) with the remainder being funded from reserves for 2013/14 only. Funding was provided on the condition that projects helped to deliver against the PCCs policing priorities and all were considered to be a means of securing crime and disorder reductions which would be measured by final outcomes.

All grant agreements issued for 2013/14 were subject to the terms and conditions set out within the Home office Agreement between the Secretary of State and the PCC for Durham for the Community Safety Fund for 2013/14. A review of terms and conditions has been carried out and revised terms will be applicable for 2104/15 grants.
