Durham County Council and Darlington MBC	Appointment of two Restorative Justice Coordinators to cover County Durham and Darlington, made in consultation with partners, in recognition of the need to provide some coordination of the varied work which is currently carried out across the area as well as the Ministry of Justice focus on developing victim initiated Restorative Justice.	£80,171
Durham Tees Valley Probation Trust	Appointment of a strategic advisor with experience in the criminal justice arena to lead a strategic victims commissioning group, that acts as a consultative and advising body, to identify, develop and shape restorative justice and victim support services in County Durham and Darlington.	£32,400
Darlington MBC	To extend the availability of restorative justice solutions for victims of crime and restorative approaches within the community, adding resilience to the team and offering an equitable service to the wider community.	£30,370
Darlington MBC	Extension of the Community Peer Mentors project which offers support to vulnerable members of the community and has potential impact to reduce service demand.	£9,300
RSACC	Extension of grant funding to deliver rape counselling support in County Durham and Darlington.	£36,030
Victim Support	The Durham OPCC and Cleveland OPCC have jointly grant-funded Victim Support to deliver a victim needs assessment and referral service during 2015/16. The OPCCs of Cleveland and Durham are combining their resources to achieve value for money.	£290,000
Victim Support	To develop the services (in collaboration with Cleveland PCC) which enable victims of crime to receive the individual tailored service to which they will be entitled from November 2015.	£27,000
Victim Support	The continuation of a project in which Victim Support employ a Mental Health Case Worker to help us better understand and identify the needs of those victims that present themselves with mental health conditions and need appropriate tailored support.	£42,000
Victim Support	The Durham PCC had funded this pilot, based in Darlington, which will inform development of the victim needs assessment process to help a victim cope and recover from the impact of a crime.	£59,225
Expanding Futures	Expanding Futures have been engaged, jointly with the Cleveland OPCC, to stimulate the supply side for a victim needs assessment and referral service. Staffordshire OPCC adopted a similar approach with some success by engaging with this organisation.	£6,000
Durham Constabulary (Through the Eyes of the Child)	This pilot (inspired by Operation Encompass) will help the police, when attending a domestic abuse incident, assess the risk and provide a response based on that risk.	£10,000
